Day 1: Tokyo / Matsumoto

Departure for Matsumoto by train from Shinjuku station in the morning. Visits and meals at your convenience

Night at the hotel.

Located in the central part of the Japanese archipelago, Matsumoto is endowed with a rich natural environment bordered by the Japanese Alps and its peaks reaching over 3000m at its west and by the "Utsukushigahara" plateau at its east. Matsumoto is the second largest city in Nagano Prefecture. It is especially famous for its castle: Matsumotojo.

Day 3: Matsumoto / Kamikochi

Departure by train and bus from Matsumoto station to Kamikochi in the morning. Visits and lunch at your convenience, dinner and night at the hotel.

In the centre of the Chubu-Sangaku National Park, Kamikochi is the best base for hiking and rock climbing in the surrounding mountains. One of the most beautiful landscapes in Japan, nature lovers will revel at the lush forests of birch and larch. The city lies in a narrow valley at an altitude of 1,500 meters along the Azusa River and is surrounded by the high peaks of the Hatoka Range, as well as Mount Yake and Mount Kasumizawa.

Swimming in the lakes is possible, but the water temperature will be about 10 degrees celcius.

Day 4: Kamikochi / Takayama

Depart for Takayama by bus.

Capital of the ancient province of Hida, the small town of Takayama, in the heart of the Japanese Alps, has many beautifully preserved historic buildings, earning it the nickname "Little Kyoto". Thanks to the work of its carpenters, renowned throughout Japan, the wooden houses, with their uniform alignment and height, offer a charming panorama. Its beef is one of the best in Japan along with that of Kobe and its excellent quality sake is also highly regarded.

Day 5: Takayama

Day 6 : Takayama / Shirakawago / Kanazawa

Depart for Shirakawago by bus in the morning. Visits and meals at your convenience. Départ for Kanazawa in the evening. Night at the hotel.

Listed as a World Heritage Site, Shirakawago is known for its telltale houses in which silkworms were bred. This architectural style, called "gassho-zukuri", refers to the houses with sloping thatched roofs which were meant to withstand the heavy snowfalls of this mountainous region.

Day 7: Kanazawa

Visits and meals at your convenience. Night at the hotel.

A trip to **Kanazawa** is a unique dive into feudal Japan. Its streets, lined with stately residences; its samurai quarters; its old pleasure districts; its castle and the magnificent Kenrokuen garden make it a most exotic destination. Kanazawa is also a conservatory of arts and crafts: Kaga-Yuzen silk kimonos, Kutani and Ohi ceramics, Wajima lacquers treated with gold leaf and powder, and much more.
